Water Conservation



The City of Everson encourages limiting water waste. Here are some ways you can help...

- Follow the voluntary watering schedule during summer months. (See below.)
- Check for running toilets and dripping faucets and repair them promptly.
Did you know a running toilet can use as much water in one month as filling a 10,000 gallon pool? That's a lot of water not to mention expensive.
- Review your water bill and compare usage from month to month. If your bill is unusually high, you may have a water leak. Look for pooling water on your property or under the house. If you don't see anything obvious, call City Hall and we can help evaluate for leaks.

A Quick Reminder about Safety and Security:

As we enter the summer season and warm weather, we often leave doors and windows open during the day and evening. If that sounds like you, remember to place something in the window track, so you can have it partially open, but still secure it. The same can be done with sliding glass doors if you have them. When you are not at home or in the evening hours, keep exterior doors to your residence locked. Also when you are not at home; leave a light, radio or TV on inside the residence. A radio or TV on inside the residence gives the appearance that someone is home. At night, you should leave an outside porch or patio light on. It is recommended that you park your vehicle in a well-lit or secure area, and do not leave valuables in the vehicle.
