SWIMMING POOL SAFETY TIPS— Please review the following information to keep your pool a safe and fun summer activity for your family.

Drowning Facts

- Drowning is the second leading cause of injury-related death for children ages 1 to 14 years old in the U.S.
- Among children ages 1 to 4 years old, most drownings occur in residential swimming pools.

Those who own pools or spas are required to meet state and local regulations to help prevent drowning.

Supervision

- Never take your eyes off children in the water—not even for a minute! Parents may think they'll hear splashing and screaming when a child is in trouble, but when a child drowns, it usually happens quickly and silently.
- Don't allow a young child in the pool without an adult.
- Knowing how to swim doesn't make a child drown-proof. Never use flotation devices as a substitute for supervision.

If a child is missing, check the pool first. Seconds count in preventing death or disability.



Install Barriers at Home Pools

- A barrier, such as a fence that is at least 4 feet high, must surround the pool or spa. The gate or door must be self-closing and self-latching with the latch out of a child's reach. If the house serves as one side of the barrier, there must be an alarm on doors that have direct access to the pool.
- For above-ground and inflatable pools with ladders, **remove** or secure the **ladder** when the pool is not in use.
- A power safety pool cover or safety cover for spas is another barrier option. The safety cover must meet ASTM standard F1346-91. If the safety cover meets standards, additional barriers, such as fencing, may be optional—check with your local city building department.
