Despite the very warm weather and drought we are experiencing, the Food Bank Garden volunteers are having a bumper season with plenty of vegetables for the food bank. We have harvested beets, beans, lettuce, onions, broccoli, cabbage, squash, peppers, cucumbers, corn, carrots. We are planting fall crops now. Please feel free to stop by and check us out. The food bank volunteers usually work on

Wednesdays for 2 hours from 5-7. Times can vary depending on the weather. The food bank keeps track of the amount of produce we provide, and we will have some total figures in the next newsletter. Last year we donated 1600 pounds of produce!

The Everson food bank garden volunteers garden in the Ramstead city park which is closed to the public this year due to needed repairs to the trail and parking lot from the flood of 2021. Our team has gotten several inquiries about gardening, and we await the official re-opening of the park. Then we will be able to invite community members to develop their own plots for gardening.
